What Will It Cost?

Program Fee

The total cost of this program is \$2,000 plus group flight (\$1,490). Please note that this is a *separate* charge from the course tuition, which will be based on the 4 credits of the on campus course component.

The program fee (and group flight payment) includes:

- Campus housing, meal plan (10 meals/week)-3 weeks
- Transportation for course related activities and travel
- Visa
- International Flight
- Lodging in Shanghai for the duration of the program
- All fees for company and cultural visits
- Breakfasts and program planned meals (i.e., welcome dinner, farewell dinner)
- Program related ground transportation in country

Fee does *not* include:

- Meals not included on itinerary
- Personal expenses

Payment Schedule

- \$500 non-refundable deposit (due upon acceptance to the course)
- Flight deposit (End of February)
- Final program fee payment (End of March)

Other Notables:

- Max. number of students : 18
- Mandatory group flight; speak to manager about variations on the return

Application Process

Eligibility

- Applicant must remain in good academic and social standing prior to participation in course.
- Applicant must be a rising Sophomore status or higher at time of course travel

Payments, Stipends, and Alternative Loans

- Any deposit to confirm a student's enrollment (and the subsequent balance of the program fee) needs to be paid directly by the student to The Glavin Office
- Tuition will be paid directly to SFS
- Up to \$2,000 stipends will be offered to current need-based financial aid recipients and full-tuition scholarship recipients to help with the cost of the program.
- Students who receive a full tuition scholarship can use a portion of their scholarship to pay for the tuition cost
- Students can choose to borrow a Federal Parent PLUS loan or a private loan to help cover additional expenses

Future Academic Planning

- If a student is enrolling in a Babson Elective Abroad during winter or summer, they may qualify for a variance from the flat rate tuition at a later point in time, typically in their senior year, based on a reduced course load. If a student does receive a variance for reduced tuition, financial aid would not be impacted. However, full tuition scholarships would be adjusted accordingly. To confirm eligibility for a future variance, contact Academic Services.
