

Visas



STUDENT FINANCIAL SERVICES

Program Fee (Glavin)

• Any deposit to confirm a student's enrollment in the course, as well as the remaining balance of the program fee, is paid directly by the student to the **Glavin Office**.

Tuition (SFS)

• Tuition for this course is included in the fall semester course load. Each Elective Abroad course is 4 credits.

STUDENT FINANCIAL SERVICES

Scholarships

• Students who receive a full-tuition scholarship can use a portion of their scholarship to pay for their tuition cost.

Grants

• Education Abroad Grants in the amount of \$2,000 are awarded to students receiving need-based Babson Grants and full-tuition scholarships (cumulative limit is \$3,000).

Loans

• Students can choose to borrow loans to help cover expenses.
