Location Information	While Babson's campus is not far from the activity of Boston, <u>Wellesley</u> is a relatively quiet community. Babson offers students a variety of <u>transportation options</u> , including a discounted <u>Zipcar</u> rental car service on campus. From nearby Riverside MBTA Station in Newton, students can take the Green Line T to downtown Boston, and commuter express buses run to downtown Boston, Newton Corner and Central Square, Waltham. This is also a station for <u>Greyhound</u> Lines and <u>Peter Pan Bus</u> lines with frequent service to Boston, New York City, and other destinations.

Visa and Immigration Requirements	The International Student Scholar Services Team assists students who need a visa to enter the United States. Upon acceptance and completion of the necessary financial support documents, students will receive a Form DS-2019, which must be submitted to the US Consulate or Embassy in the student's home country, along with the visa application and other required documents needed to obtain a J-1 Exchange Visitor Student Visa.	
Mandatory Health Insurance	As a student at Babson, all exchange participants are required to enroll in a comprehensive health insurance plan . Students will be automatically enrolled in Babson's Health Insurance plan unless a student provides proof of alternative coverage which meets both the <u>Massachusetts State requirements</u> and federal <u>J-1 regulations</u> , and a waiver is granted. <u>Learn more about the Health Requirements</u> .

Courses	For a list of course offerings, visit the <u>Babson Course Listings</u> . Select "Graduate Program," the intended semester of study, sort by "Division." Courses will be sorted by disciplines, and listed by course code and title. Click on the blue +/- to access basic information about the course, such as the time it meets and the name of the professor. General searches about courses can be found on the <u>Course Catalog</u> .
Language	All courses are taught in English. Intensive English language courses are not offered at Babson.
Course Load	In order to maintain J-1 immigration status, exchange students must remain enrolled in a minimum of 12 credits per semester ("full-time status"). Depending on language proficiency level and home university requirements, undergraduate exchange students take between 12 and 18 credits per semester (equivalent to 4-5 courses). Graduate exchange students may take no more than 18 credits per semester. Additional credit hour information.
Grading	Babson uses a "letter grading" system. A single final grade will be entered for each course on the student's record. The grades are indicated by one of these letters: A, excellent; B, above satisfactory; C, satisfactory; D, below satisfactory; and F, failing. Each letter grade can also have a corresponding plus (+) or negative (-) to illustrate a grade slightly higher or lower than the stated letter grade. The undergraduate school does not issue a grade of A+.
Assessment and Examinations	Students are evaluated at the end of the semester as well as continuously throughout the semester. The assessment of student performance varies: essays, in-class presentations, written quizzes and examinations, and group projects. Attendance and class participation also contribute to the final grade. General exam information can be found here .
	Housing and Co-Curricular
On-Campus Accommodations	Due to the high demand for on-campus accommodation, graduate exchange students are not guaranteed on-campus accommodation, and are strongly encouraged to secure off-campus housing. When available, Graduate Housing is typically in the form of studio or one-bedroom apartments. The Office of Residence Life maintains a list of available rentals and other resources to assist students in their search for housing. The College does not investigate or endorse any off-campus housing, and living off-campus may require the need to secure independent transportation to/from campus. 	*Exchange students are eligible to receive care at the on-campus Health Services. The professional staff includes a team of nurse practitioners, a registered nurse, a part-time physician, and a health educator. A physician is on call 24 hours a day and, when appropriate, referrals are made to independent health care specialists in the surrounding areas.
